This means that you and the social worker must work together to change your behavior and encourage you to stop further offending.</p> <p>You will work with the social worker to complete the requirements of the order and the social worker will assess your risk of offending and harm during the order. You will be able to discuss any problems with him or her and you need to work together in finding answers to them. You and the social worker have to arrange how the CPO is to be worked out in practice.</p> <p><b>Failing to Comply</b> If you fail to comply with any of the conditions and requirements of your CPO, your order will be returned to court under breach proceedings. You can be brought back to court and be dealt with for the original offence. You may be given a custodial sentence for the offence(s) for which the CPO was made. The court may decide to change your order. This may mean making it longer or adding other requirements.</p> <p><b>Early Discharge</b> If you do very well, the court can be asked to consider ending the order early. Either you or the social worker can ask the Court to do that.</p>

## TEMPORARY COMMUNITY PAYBACK ORDER (CPO)

<b>WHAT YOU HAVE TO DO</b>	<b>WHAT THE SOCIAL WORKER HAS TO DO</b>
<p>While you are subject to a CPO you must:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Not commit any more offences</li> <li>(2) Be of good behavior</li> <li>(3) See your worker when told to do so</li> <li>(4) Tell your worker at once if you change your address</li> <li>(5) Tell your worker of any times at which you work, carry out voluntary work or attend for education</li> <li>(6) Tell your worker at once if you change your job</li> <li>(7) Comply with the conditions and requirements of the CPO.</li> </ol>	<p>The social worker has to do two things:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>(1) Give you whatever advice and assistance he or she can. In particular he or she will try to help you keep out of trouble. The social worker will need to see you and get to know you so that you can be given this help</li> <li>(2) The social worker also has to make sure you carry out the Court order. If you do not carry out the CPO, the social worker will have to bring you back before the Court.</li> </ol>
