**Our focus..... Your priorities**

### **INTRODUCTION**

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Eaglesham & Waterfoot Community Council** area for the 5 week period **8<sup>th</sup> February to 7<sup>th</sup> March 2018**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

### **INFORMATION**

#### **1. Homes being broken into**

One theft by Housebreaking has been reported in your Community Council area during the 4 week period under review.

About 3-10am on the 23<sup>rd</sup> February a house in Low Borland Way, Waterfoot, was broken in to. The resident was awoken, and on being disturbed the suspects made off. A number of items were stolen.

Extensive enquiries have been made, and are ongoing, into this crime.

#### **2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder**

There have been no calls relating to public nuisance or disturbances in your community council area from members of the public during the period under review.

### **3. Violent crime**

No crimes of violence in public locations in your Community Council area have been reported during the period under review.

### **4. Drug dealing and misuse**

Our officers continue to carry out pro-active patrols in your area. During the last four weeks, the following drugs offences have been detected by officers from our Local Policing Teams and our Local Problem Solving Teams

- 15/02/18 : Moor Road, Eaglesham – 56 year old male in possession of cannabis
- 21/02/18 : Moor Road, Eaglesham – 24 year old male in possession of cannabis
- 22/02/18 : Bonnyton Moor Road, Eaglesham - 19 year old male in possession of cannabis
