Our focus..... Your priorities

INTRODUCTION

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Eaglesham & Waterfoot Community Council** area for the 5 week period **8th March to 4th April 2018**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

INFORMATION

1. Homes being broken into

No homes have been broken in to in your community council area during the period under review.

About 6pm on the 24th March at an address in Cheapside Street, Eaglesham, an attempt was made to break in to a shed. Construction works were ongoing at the unoccupied premises.

2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder

There have been no calls relating to public nuisance or disturbances in your community council area from members of the public during the period under review.

One vandalism has been reported to property within the playground at Eaglesham Primary School overnight on the 26th into 27th March. Officers are following a positive line of enquiry into this matter.

3. Violent crime

No crimes of violence in public locations in your Community Council area have been reported during the period under review.

4. Drug dealing and misuse

On the 29th March 2018 officers executed a Sheriff's search warrant obtained under the Misuse of Drugs Act at an address in Picketlaw Road, Eaglesham. A 23 year old man is the subject of a report to the procurator fiscal for an offence relating to the possession of a controlled drug.

On the 8th of March, officers carrying out pro-active patrols in your area searched a 23 year old man in Glasgow Road, Eaglesham, who was found to be in possession of a quantity of cannabis.

NEWS

You will hopefully recall the "Your View Counts" survey that was launched in 2016 by Police Scotland. The first year results of this survey were published previously and are being used to inform the local policing plan for East Renfrewshire and East Renfrewshire Council's Local Improvement Plan.
