Our focus..... Your priorities

INTRODUCTION

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Eaglesham & Waterfoot Community Council** area for the 5 week period **10th May to 5th June 2018**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

INFORMATION

1. Homes being broken into

No homes have been broken in to in your community council area during the period under review.

Sometime between the 8th and the 13th May, a quantity of tools were stolen from insecure farm outbuildings in the vicinity of Eaglesham.

During the afternoon/evening hours of the 14th May, pedal cycles were stolen from gardens in both Holehouse Road and Park Crescent, Eaglesham. Two bikes stolen from Holehouse Road were subsequently recovered in Polnoon Drive. The owner of two bicycles stolen from Park Crescent has also recovered these, having found them in possession of a group of male youths on the Eaglesham Moor Road. These suspects remain unidentified at this time.

2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder

There has been one report of public nuisance during the period under review on the afternoon of 26th May at Park Crescent. Police were in attendance within a short time of the call being received.

No other reports of public nuisance or disorder in public places have been received during the period under review.

3. Violent crime

No crimes of violence in public locations in your Community Council area have been recorded during the period under review.

4. Drug dealing and misuse

About 10-30pm on the 16th May, officers on patrol in your area stopped a 20 year old male driver on Kirkton Moor Road. He was subsequently found in possession of cannabis.

Now that warmer weather has arrived and we are spending more time following outdoors pursuits, please remember to secure valuable items such as bicycles at the end of each day. Across East Renfrewshire we have received a number of reports of thefts of property from gardens.
