



## **Community Council Meeting Updates**

**Our focus..... Your priorities**

### **INTRODUCTION**

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Eaglesham & Waterfoot Community Council** area for the 5 week period **6<sup>th</sup> June to 4<sup>th</sup> July 2018**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

### **INFORMATION**

#### **1. Homes being broken into**

About 11-10am on the morning of the 9<sup>th</sup> June, a sneak-in theft occurred at a house in the Newton Mearns area, during which a car was stolen. Shortly thereafter, officers, who were searching for the stolen car came across the stolen vehicle as it made off from an address in Eaglesham Road, Eaglesham. The 37 year old male driver was apprehended and it was established that the house in Eaglesham Road had also been broken in to, although nothing was stolen. The accused has since been remanded to prison where he remains pending further criminal proceedings.

#### **2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder**

During the period under review there have been no reports of any public nuisance or disorder in public places in your community council area.

No crimes relating to anti-social behaviour or disorder have been recorded.

### **3. Violent crime**

No crimes of violence in public locations in your Community Council area have been recorded during the period under review.

### **4. Drug dealing and misuse**

About 10-05pm on the 20<sup>th</sup> June, officers on patrol in your area stopped a 17 year old male driver near to Whitelee Windfarm Visitor Centre. He was subsequently found in possession of cannabis.

## **CRIME PREVENTION**

Please remember to keep doors and windows of your home locked and secure. Always check your property before retiring to bed at night. Do not leave garden tools, ladders *etc.* in your garden overnight; lock them away. Such items can often be used by housebreakers to overcome the security of homes. Keep sheds and garages locked.
