INTRODUCTION

This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the **Barrhead Community Council** area for the period **28th December 2018 to 31st January 2019**. A list of these priorities is provided at the end of this report for your reference.

This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent.

This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader.

INFORMATION

1. Homes being broken in to

Over the Holiday period 2 homes were broken into. Enquires ongoing

About this time a male was arrested for entering the curtilage of premises in the Barrhead area.

On the 26th January 2019 a housebreaking was recorded.

An industrial unit was also broken into and cable stolen from within.

2. Antisocial behaviour and disorder

8 incidents of persons causing fear and alarm have been recorded.

15 incidents of vandalism have been recorded

6 of these incidents included damage to motor vehicles

4 incidents included damage to main doors of properties.

One incident recorded damage to a poppy display within the grounds of a local church.

3. Violent Crime

16 assaults have been reported to the police within this time period.

4. Drug dealing and misuse

Proactive policing has resulted in

1x person being charged for being in possession of Heroin.

4x persons charged for being in possession of Cocaine.

2x persons charged for being in possession of Valium tablets.

2x persons charged for being in possession of Cannabis.
