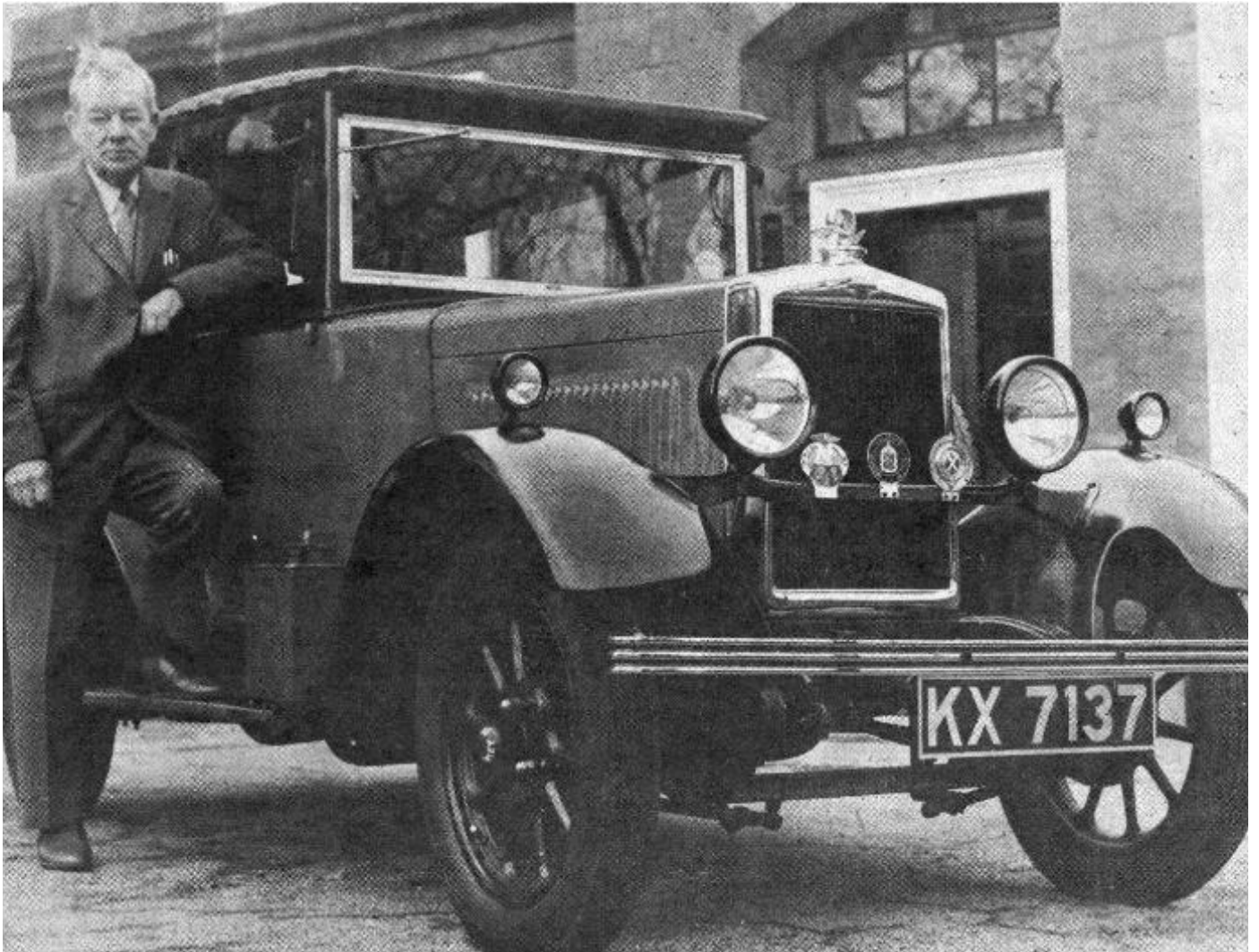

Name of creator	[Sir] Dr. James W. Macfarlane.
Administrative/ biographical history	<p>These albums were created by Dr Macfarlane detailing his professional work and other interests.</p> <p>Dr MacFarlane was chairman of the East Renfrewshire Unionist Association. He represented Netherlee Ward on Renfrew County Council as an independent from 1949, and latterly as a Conservative. He was Vice-Convenor of the County by 1957 and was Convenor until 1973.</p> <p>Dr Macfarlane received a knighthood in 1973 for services to local government.</p>
Archival history	<p>The albums were deposited with the Council presumably at some point after Dr Macfarlane's death in 1974, and by 2007 were held by East Renfrewshire Council's Libraries Section.</p> <p>These volumes were initially considered to be part of the archives of the County but it was decided in 2009 to list them as a separate fonds.</p>
Immediate source of acquisition	The albums were transferred from the Library Section's store at "the Bothy" to ERC Archives as part of A/C 2007/05.
Scope and content	<p>Dr. Macfarlane was Convenor of the County of Renfrew and these records detail the work of the Council and also touch on some other interests of Dr. MacFarlane, including his work as an engineer and as Managing Director of Macfarlane Engineering Company</p> <p>vintage cars & motor cycles, sea cadets</p> <p>also Chairman of the Western Area Fire Cmtee</p> <p>Dr Macfarlane was also a Commissioner of Income Tax for the Upper Ward of Renfrew</p> <p>the albums mostly comprise newspaper clippings from local and Scottish titles, but also include leaflets, dinner invitations, photographs and correspondence.</p>
Appraisal, destruction and scheduling information	All records which transferred to the archives have been retained
Accruals	No further accruals are expected.
System of arrangement	<p>The five albums were created in chronological order, and this is reflected in their being listed 1-5.</p> <p>Each album is listed with a note of some of the main features of interests noted.</p>
Conditions governing access	There are no restrictions on access
Finding aids	An item level has been prepared and is searchable on the archives database.
Allied materials	ERC Archives holds some material from the County of Renfrew; the bulk of that archive is held by the City of Glasgow

County business (particularly structural planning), but also with a number of biographical features on Dr MacFarlane. Also including information on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> the national road development program, 1967 and the opening of the "Renfrew Bypass Motorway", 1968, and subsequent road and motorway building; a proposed oil refinery at Bishopton, 1967-1969; development of the Erskine Bridge, 1968 & 1970; Erskine New Town, 1968-1970; development of the Hunterson industrial site, 1969-1970; plans for local government re-organisation, 1969-1970; the Council's first purchase of a computer, 1969; opening of the Renfrewshire [Clyde Muirshiel] Regional Park, 1970. 	1967 - 1970	1

County business, in particular including information on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> sales of Council houses, 1971; local government reform; the "Erskine New Community", 1970-1973; opening of the Erskine Bridge, and its subsequent under use, 1971-1972; Netherlee Pavilion, 1971; Clarkston gas explosion ["Clarkston Disaster"], 1971; Dr. MacFarlane's work on attracting inward investment; Dr Macfarlane's knighthood, 1972-1973; the opening of Paisley Fire Station, 1973; election defeat of Sir James (Conservative) by George T.
