BACKGROUND

What is East Renfrewshire's Vocational programme?

East Renfrewshire's Vocational Programme brings various council services together with local employers and colleges of further education, to provide a range of stimulating vocational courses for pupils. The programme currently offers approximately 500 places providing a broader range of options for East Renfrewshire pupils entering 5th or 6th year (with S4 places available) offering them the opportunity to study for a vocational or national qualification together with their other subjects.

Who can apply for a place on the programme?

Pupils attending East Renfrewshire secondary schools who are about to enter 5th or 6th year (S4 are eligible). Places are limited; therefore pupils will be nominated and interviewed by their school prior to a place being offered. If courses are oversubscribed or pupils are unsuccessful they will be placed on a reserve list and advised if a place becomes available.

How is the programme delivered?

Courses run during the academic year and will be delivered within the school week. Locations and duration are given in the appropriate programme page. Pupils do not attend during in-service days, exams, public holidays and/or school holidays.

Please note, to comply with current restrictions, when possible, we have adapted many courses to on-line or blended learning.

What is a Foundation Apprenticeship?

A Foundation Apprenticeship can help young people gain valuable, real-world work experience and access work-based learning while still at school, closing the gap between the classroom and the workplace.

By giving young people earlier exposure to the world of work, we're helping them develop the skills, experience and knowledge they'll need when they leave school.

For young people it's the chance to get a head start on their careers by gaining an industry-recognised qualification, work on real projects and broaden their career options when they leave school.

And for employers, it's the chance to attract highly motivated and committed young people who are willing to learn, identify young people who are right for their business and ensure their organisation has people with the skills they need.

Learning in the workplace

Foundation Apprenticeships are a work-based learning opportunity for secondary school pupils in S4/5/6. Pupils will spend time at college or the workplace either physically or remotely to achieve the Foundation Apprenticeship alongside their other subjects like National 5s and Highers.

The qualification is linked to one of six key sectors of the Scottish economy, so young people are getting industry experience which will help them kick-start a successful career in their chosen field.

A Foundation Apprenticeship can lead straight into a job, further study at college or university, or a Modern Apprenticeship.

You may wish to source a work placement yourself. You should speak to your school about the necessary Health & Safety paperwork required.



GENERAL INFORMATION

Joining

- All secondary schools in East Renfrewshire participate in this programme, so places are limited. The vocational programme office and your school can provide you and your parents with further information on each option and its availability
- You will discuss with your Pastoral/Pupil Support Teacher the most suitable course
- Prior to starting and once your place has been confirmed your parent or carer must complete a "joining form" available online
- The joining form provides permission for you to attend

Transport

- Transport will take you to your location and will return you back to school at the end of the afternoon
- If you do not live near the school your parent or carer will need to make arrangements to pick you up at the end of the day if they do not wish you to make your own way home
- There may be some independent travel

Health & Safety

As some of the options will require you to operate equipment, use tools or work in certain specialised areas, special clothing may be required, known as "personal protective equipment" (PPE). If required you will be provided with PPE.

- You must bring your PPE each week. Please complete this section online.
- All training venues, activities and tasks that you undertake have been risk assessed to ensure safety standards are met
- You are expected to conduct yourself in a safe and appropriate manner

• All bus and taxi drivers work to specific standards, fully observing health and safety regulations

How will a vocational course help me?

• Vocational courses are intended to provide a pathway for you to employment, training or further and higher education

Who would consider these options?

- You should be well mannered, mature, well behaved and keen to adapt to a college learning environment
- You should be interested in learning about your chosen option
- You should be prepared to fully participate in all aspects of the programme
- You should be working at the appropriate level in school with an aptitude and enthusiasm for your chosen option

The difference

- Vocational qualifications are part of the same structure and covered by the same arrangements as subjects delivered in school
- Whilst progressing through the programme, you will naturally work towards five core skills which are transferable into the world of work: communication, numeracy, working with others, problem solving and information technology
- All courses have been developed to recognise the needs of future employers, and in most cases the relevant industry sector has assisted with the development of the course.

UP IN THE AIR AND ON THE GROUND

City of Glasgow College – City Campus SCQF Level 4/5 – *Open to S5/6 Pupils*

COURSE OUTLINE

This course brings together the world of travel, events and hospitality in an innovative and inspirational way. A practical course which will focus on developing a range of skills within the City of Glasgow College CITYAIR resource which is a simulated airline cabin and purpose built Airline Check in desks. You will develop a range of food and drink service skills from counter service to Barista training, plan and participate in events within a realistic live restaurant environment. To further enhance learning, visits are included to Tourist destinations within the city and Glasgow Airport.

ATTENDANCE PATTERN

Tuesday & Thursday afternoons (1.30pm to 4pm). The duration of the course is August to April.

You must have:

ACCOUNTANCY – FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIP City of Glasgow College, Glasgow Kelvin College or West College Scotland SCQF Level 6 – Open to S5 Pupils for 2 Year Model / S6 for I Year Model

COURSE OUTLINE

The aim of the Foundation Apprenticeship Accounting course is to help you understand and use financial information. You will learn to record financial accounting information (and bookkeeping), prepare financial information, indirect tax, analysing accounting information, management accounting and professional ethics for accountants.

CRIMINOLOGY AND LAW

Glasgow Clyde College – Langside Campus SCQF Level 7 – *Open to S6 Pupils*

COURSE OUTLINE

Glasgow Clyde College will provide you with the opportunity to gain a Personal Development Award in Criminology with Law. The award aims to provide you with an understanding of the accused's journey through the Scottish Criminal Justice System. You will be given the opportunity to compare the Scottish legal system with that of other countries and through this, discuss the efficacy of the Criminal Justice System, reoffending rates and noncustodial sentences. In addition, you will cover sociological theories of crime and deviance with the topic of the mass media and its influence on public perception being analysed.

ATTENDANCE PATTERN

Tuesday and Thursday afternoons (1.30pm to 4pm). The duration of the course is August until April.

PUPIL ELIGIBILITY

You must have:

• Higher English at A or B level

QUALIFICATION BREAKDOWN

This course is demanding in terms of written work, study at home and group work.

COURSE ASSESSMENT

The course will be assessed in a variety of ways including essay responses and closed book assessment and a research assignment. The assessment approach will enable you to engage in independent research and develop the skills you will require for university entry.

WHAT OPPORTUNITIES WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ME WHEN I FINISH?

You might go on to do:

- Full time higher education course in social science at college or university, degree courses in law, social sciences, criminology or business studies. The level you might enter would depend on the level and relevance of your other qualifications.
- For those interested in studying Law at university this provides an excellent introduction to the institutions, individuals and procedures involved in the Scottish Legal System.

COURSE OUTLINE

The aim of the Foundation Apprenticeship is to provide you with the opportunity to learn about competent occupational practices within the financial sector. You will learn more about workplace practices including industry specific skills.

You will learn about baking, how to select a product to bake, identify the ingredients required, and follow the correct sequence to make your chosen product using the correct tools safely and hygienically along with general horticulture duties. The programme ends with you harvesting vegetables and herbs in May and using these, we hope to prepare a lunch in June for invited guests and family.

ATTENDANCE PATTERN

Wednesday (10am to 12 noon). The duration of the course is August to June

PUPIL ELIGIBILITY

You should have:

- An interest in Horticulture
- An interest in Bakery

VOCATIONAL OPTION BREAKDOWN

One SQA SCQF Level 1 Unit:

• Food Preparation: Baking

GARDENING SKILLS – COLLEGE CERTIFICATE

- Indoor Propagation growing from seed, taking cuttings, feeding, watering and pricking out
- Outdoor Cultivation ground preparation, weeding, planting out and watering

COURSE OUTLINE

The aim of the Introduction to Barista course is to provide you with the opportunity to develop basic practical skills necessary to work in the coffee barista industry. Whether you intend to work as a barista, or are planning to run a cafe or coffee cart or just passionate about coffee, this is the course for you.

The course covers:

- Perfecting espresso extraction times
- Tamping and packing coffee for shots

- Smoothies

You will need to be 18 years of age or older for some of the jobs in this sector.

INTRODUCTION TO TEACHER EDUCATION

University of Strathclyde – John Anderson Campus *Open to S6 Pupils*

COURSE OUTLINE

The Introduction to Teacher Education will provide you with an introduction to the teaching profession – both primary and secondary. You will explore four themes, where you will be drawing on your previous experiences to highlight your own key strengths and examining how these attributes are desirable in Education. You will look at what you know about pupil engagement and success in learning and will experience different approaches. You will have the opportunity to consider the various components that contribute to effective learning and teaching and build skills in these areas. You will get the opportunity to plan, design deliver and evaluate lessons and learning opportunities. Links will be made to any work experience/volunteering you are currently undertaking.

In addition, you will review what you know about learning and teaching, and identifying what you have gained from the programme with a view to supporting you in generating your personal statements, assisting and preparing you for the application process.

POOL LIFEGUARDING

East Renfrewshire Culture and Leisure SCQF Level 5 *– Open to S5/6 Pupils*

COURSE OUTLINE

The National Pool Lifeguard Qualification is the most widely recognised lifeguard qualification in the UK & Ireland and is a requirement for most lifeguarding jobs in the country. East Renfrewshire Culture and Leisure will provide you with the opportunity to develop the knowledge and practical skills to work as a pool provide lifeguard and administer first aid as required, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), automatic external defibrillator (AED) and pool related rescue equipment.

ATTENDANCE PATTERN

Friday morning (8:45am to 10.15am). The duration of the course is August to April.

PUPIL ELIGIBILITY

You must:

- Be 16 years of age at the start of the course
- Be able to meet the following criteria:
 - jump/dive into deep water
 - swim 50 meters in less than 60 second
 - swim 100 meters continuously on front and back in deep water
 - tread water for 30 seconds
 - surface dive to the floor of the pool
 - climb out unaided without ladder/steps and where the pool design permits

QUALIFICATION BREAKDOWN

IQL Level 2 Award in Pool Lifeguarding, Intervention, Supervision and Rescue – SCQF Level 5

- The Lifeguard and the Law, Swimming Pool Supervision
- Intervention and Rescue and Emergency Action Plans
- Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation, AED and First Aid

Please note, this course is physically demanding and will include swimming to set times, lifting casualties and diving in to the deepest part of the swimming pool.

WHAT OPPORTUNITIES WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ME WHEN I FINISH?

- Employment as a Swimming pool attendant, recreation assistant, or beach lifeguard
- Scottish Vocational Qualification (SVQ) in Sport and Recreation

SPORT COACHING THROUGH PLAY

COURSE OUTLINE

The National Progression Award (NPA) in Sport Coaching Through Play will develop your knowledge and skills of the Coaching process - Planning, Delivering and Evaluating. The course takes a practical approach, and you will have the opportunity to take part in all aspects of coaching and playing various sports both indoor and outdoor. In addition, you will take part in sports such as, badminton, basketball, volleyball, football, rugby, hockey and American football.

Tuesday and Thursday afternoons (1.30pm to 4pm). The duration of the course is August to April.

PUPIL ELIGIBILITY

You must have:

- 3 passes at National 5
- a passionate interest in playing sport, coaching sport and/or personal fitness or fitness instructing

Some of the units studied will involve examining criminology, evaluating the Scottish legal system, developing your individual fitness, improving your team working skills and getting a high quality work placement.

ATTENDANCE PATTERN

Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday (times to be confirmed).

Please note, that unlike other options, this course requires continuous attendance from August to June and may impact on other subjects attendance. In addition, you will travel independently by bus or train – travel tickets should be kept as you will be reimbursed by school.

You must have:

- 2 passes at Higher
- 3 other subjects at National 5, 1 of which should be English

AUTOMOTIVE SKILLS – FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIP

West College Scotland - Paisley Campus SCQF Level 4 - Open to S5/6 Pupils

COURSE OUTLINE

The Skills for Work in Automotive Skills and Greenpower challenge will give you an opportunity to develop basic practical skills necessary to work in the automotive industry. You will gain experience of carrying out basic vehicle checks, including the specific skills involved in removal and replacement of components and mechanisms of a vehicle. Relevant jobs such as light and heavy vehicle maintenance, motorcycle maintenance, vehicle fitting, auto electrical, accident repair – body and paint operations, parts distribution and roadside assistance. You will gain an overview and an awareness of the skills required by employers within this industry.

ATTENDANCE PATTERN

Tuesday all day. The duration of the course is August to April.

PUPIL ELIGIBILITY

You must:

• Have a genuine interest in car mechanics and enjoy working as part of a team

WHAT OPPORTUNITIES WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ME WHEN I FINISH?

You might go on to do:

- City & Guilds (Entry Level) Automotive Vehicle Maintenance and Repair
- Employment opportunities after training such as, Motor Vehicle Technician Apprentice or Car Valet

This course will allow a taste of what to expect in the vehicle repair industry. It will give knowledge which could assist in getting a Modern Apprentice position within a garage or alternatively access to a further education course.



INFORMATION

What if I don't like some of the elements or aspects of my course?

You will be asked to fill in an on-line questionnaire to let training providers know what you think of your vocational course. It's important to keep talking to your pupil support teacher at school so that any problems can be dealt with quickly and effectively. We want to ensure that you enjoy your vocational course and that you attend regularly and successfully complete the course.

How do I get there?

Courses take place in a variety of training establishments; we will arrange transport to and from your placement or training centre. We will let you know the transport details in advance of your course starting. Transport will be by bus or taxi with some pupils travelling independently, you will be advised in advance if this is the case and will be reimbursed of all travel costs.

How are the vocational course options different from the subjects that I take at school?

Vocational courses have a strong focus on building skills for life and skills for work. They can lead to awards such as Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs), City and Guilds (C&G), Higher National Certificates (HNCs) and National Certificates (NCs). This booklet will tell you about the awards and provides a breakdown of each qualification.

How will the courses be certified?

When you receive your certificate from the Scottish Qualifications Authority (SQA), your vocational courses will appear alongside the awards for courses you have completed in school.

Health and Safety

Risk assessments are completed to ensure that health and safety regulations are met in full. Your parent/carer will be asked to complete a consent form before you start your vocational course. If you enrol for a course which requires personal protective clothing or equipment, this will be provided for you.

What is The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework?

The Scottish Credit and Qualifications Framework (SCQF) is a system where school, vocational, university degree and post graduate qualifications are aligned with one another and placed on levels. National 5 is an SCQF level 5 qualification and a Higher Grade is an SCQF level 6 qualification. (Please see page 6 for the framework).

What is the difference between a National 4 or a National 5 qualification taken in school or at college?

National 4 and National 5 qualifications are at the same level on the SCQF framework (see page 6) whether they are taken in school or at college.

Which S4 pupils should opt for the vocational courses in this leaflet?

Places are limited for S4 pupils and must be discussed with your pupil support teacher. Vocational courses are challenging, flexible and offer plenty of scope to suit different preferred learning styles. They are ideal for pupils who want to leave school at the end of S4 or progression into an S5 Vocational course.

It sounds great - how do I apply?

Places are limited; therefore you should speak to your pupil support teacher who will discuss your options. You should also read the option details of the course you are interested in and discuss with your parent/carer.
