POLICE REPORT	The Chairperson presented the Police Report:		
	"This report covers progress we have made in dealing with your priorities for the Broom, Kirkhill & Mearnskirk Community Council area for the period <b>22nd September</b> <b>2022 to 22nd October 2022.</b> Details of the current policing plan, incorporating the policing priorities, are provided at the end of this report for your reference.		
	This report aims to highlight emerging issues in your area, and to provide crime prevention advice and guidance to the members of the Community Council and to the residents that they represent. Police Scotland provides the report as a courtesy and is not a statutory requirement. We endeavour to provide a report to the Community Council in advance of each of their meetings.		
	Community Police are increasing foot patrols in your local area given the increased footfall. We encourage constituents to speak with Police if seen in their local community.		
	This document does not provide a comprehensive statistical breakdown of numbers of crimes reported as this does not provide any context for the reader. Neither does it aim to document every crime recorded in your community council area. Crime statistics are published quarterly on the Police Scotland website and can be found

## **CRIMES OF NOTE & CRIME PREVENTION ADVICE**

Crime levels in your community council area remain very low. Throughout the local authority, there has been a small number of thefts by housebreakings; additional advice on prevention may be found further in this report or from community officers at Giffnock Police station.

#### **Home security**

As it is getting darker earlier with each passing day it is asked that constituents are reminded of the importance of maintaining home and vehicle security. Crime prevention advice can be found on Police Scotland's webpage via the links below.

- Remove valuables from cars.

- Take time to ensure your car is locked.

- If you have keyless entry/start consider key security within your home or purchase a Faraday pouch to help prevent theft.

We would also like to highlight the importance of keeping keyless entry vehicle keys secure in a Faraday pouch to prevent the chance of relay vehicle theft.

	Peter Barry commented the official crime statistics for Police Scotland (available online) state there have been 0 serious crimes in East Renfrewshire for August 2022.	
	This cannot be correct and ought to be queried. Are crimes not being recorded?

	They are keen to improve access and transport links. Public transport is non-existent and travel is difficult without a car.	
BUS/PUBLIC	Bus Services from Maidenhill	
TRANSPORT	The Chairperson advised that First Bus will not provide a service until the building site (Maidenhill Development) is complete.	
	Fiona advised that the developers provided a fund to be used for subsidising public transport. A tender has gone out and it is proposed that a service should be starting next spring, running buses from Maidenhill to Patterton

	Station and then onto Silverburn.	
	Peter stated there should be an increased demand on trains and buses once the emissions charge for Glasgow comes into force.	
	Margaret Hinchliffe advised there is a need for a bus from the Newton Mearns area to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital. The lack of public transport makes attending appointments and visiting friends/relatives in hospital difficult and expensive. You either have to travel by car or taxi.	
	Many older people have to attend appointments at this hospital and find travelling there very stressful.	
	Margaret advised the Scottish Community Council newsletter mentioned that Ferintosh CC have acquired a bus for their community use.	
	Stagecoach and the Highland Council got together with the CC and they agreed an arrangement to run a service during the day and then used trained volunteers to run it at night for a nominal fare. Local residents phone and request the bus. The service will drop them at the most convenient connection to a regular bus or train service.	
	Anne asked if we could use windfarm money to fund a local service - Could we put this suggestion to the Council?	
	Fiona said residents at Maidenhill have to pay for a private coach service to take their children to Mearns Castle – Maidenhill lies just inside the Scottish Government school bus guidelines of 3 miles from the High school. They either have to pay for this service or drive their children to school.	
	BKMCC to write to First Bus asking them to extend bus route 4 to include Maidenhill.	
	Fiona mentioned this would actually be difficult at the moment until the loop road is finished as there is nowhere for a bus to turn inside the estate.	
BUDGET BRIEFING	Budget Briefing 2023-2026 7 <sup>th</sup> October	
2023-2026	The Chairperson reported on the ERC Budget Briefing fronted by the Chair of Cabinet, Cllr O'Donnell and published on the 4 <sup>th</sup> October 2022.	
	Total budget is £339m per year, of which:	
	<ul> <li>55% (£188.2m) is provided by the Scottish Government.</li> </ul>	
	• £62.2m from Council Tax	
	• £38.3m from Government Grants	
	• £35.7m other income fees and charges	



The Budget will have to be trimmed by approx. £30m

ERC have ring-fenced Education.

ERC say have been upgrading health facilities and Bonnyton Care Home. But the healthcare provision in our CC area remains very poor.

Major projects include:

- £25m New primary school in Neilston
- £55m New Eastwood leisure centre
- £2.5m City deal project for Dams
- £6m Extra on road repairs
- £1.9m new sports facility at MCHS
- 200 new council houses at 7 sites across East Renfrewshire

The Chairperson advised ERC are going to carry out a budget consultation during November and December to see how they can trim the budget to save the  $\pm 30$ m. There are two consultations scheduled for  $15^{th}$  and  $29^{th}$  November. Following consideration of the consultations ERC will set the budget on March  $1^{st}$  2023.

## Local facility upgrading funding

Money has been provided by Central Government for the upgrading of local facilities in CC areas. The total amount available within East Renfrewshire is £551,100 spread over 5 years.

Allocated already approved:

- Replace and renew stage lighting in Clarkston Hall £77,000
- Refurbishment of Cowan Park Bandstand £100,000
- Replace litter bins in Neilston, Thornliebank and Barrhead Main Streets £15,000
- Busby park upgrade £15k
- Install digital community notice boards in Barrhead, Giffnock, Clarkston and Eaglesham £61,291
- Installation of Digital Signs at the Avenue to provide updates about retailers at the avenue £139,000 and Mearns Workshop.

Will to write and ask if Avenue signs are for community use.

There are no litter bins in Maidenhill – maybe allocate the

SPORTS FIELD BROOM PARK	The new Mearns Castle High School sports facilities are developing well and scheduled to be completed before Christmas.		
BRIDGE AT BROOM BURN	There has been no progress – the contractor has experienced difficulty obtaining materials. It is hoped to be repaired sometime in November.		
TRAFFIC SIGNAGE ON MEARNSKIRK ROAD	Janet asked our Police contact if there had been any accidents in this area – he advised none had been reported to the police. Although we know of two head-on collisions which have occurred in the new 'traffic calming' section.		
	The Chairperson wrote to the Police and asked about accidents and speeding on this road. He received a response saying there have been no reported accidents or speeding.		
	Will also wrote to ERC Roads Department about the wires across Waterfoot Road but received no response. It was suggested that Will should rewrite our query to Roads at East Renfrewshire.	Will to rewrite Roads letter	



	It was suggested that a petition signed by many residents might help encourage Roads Department to do something about speeding in Waterfoot Road.
